Project Guide

How to participate:

- Complete application found on our website, NCFeralSwine.org and return to your Local Soil and Water Conservation District. After the application is received, it will be reviewed by program staff and eligibility for participation in the Trap Loan Program will be determined.
- Applications will be processed on a first come first serve basis but if the number of requests exceeds the number of available traps then a need based determination will be made when loaning out the equipment.

Pre-Loan Assessment:

- Once an application is received and processed the first step to receiving equipment is completion of a pre-loan assessment. The purpose of this assessment is to determine the extent, monetary value, and dates of the damage caused by feral swine to the property. This information will give us a baseline feral swine activity to compare to once trapping has been completed. Pre-loan assessments are conducted by local staff and may include representatives from the North Carolina Department of Agriculture, North Carolina Wildlife Resources Commission, North Carolina Cooperative Extension, and Local Soil and Water Districts.

Trap Demonstration and Training:

- In order to receive a trap, loan program participants will be trained by trainer and sign waiver upon receipt. The purpose of this training is to demonstrate safe and proper operation of the trap and equipment including; set up, breakdown, and camera operation. In addition, the training will cover topics such as pre-baiting, safe depopulation, and disposal. You will be contacted by your local staff to schedule this training and once training has been completed you will receive a copy of the North Carolina Feral Swine Trap Loan Program Trapping Manual for your reference.
- At the conclusion of training you will be asked to sign a trap lease agreement to be able to utilize the equipment.

Post Loan Assessment:

- The applicant agrees to complete all surveys provided by the North Carolina Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services in a timely manner, including post trapping surveys that monitor the population of remaining feral swine. Such information is necessary for the department to evaluate the effectiveness of the feral swine trapping program and assist with future planning and response to the feral swine issue.

Trap Return:

- Applicant and/or local staff will schedule a time to get trap from applicants property. The checklist will need to be completed to ensure all equipment is still part of trailer/trap and in working condition. Local staff will be responsible for sanitizing prior to loaning out to another applicant.
